- 1. Corey has been Superintendant at Broken Top since 2017, but arrived at Broken Top in 2014 as the Lead Assistant under Scott Moffenbeier (now of Bend Golf and Country Club). He has had an incredibly varied work experience and truly loves golf and the course itself. Locally, he has served as an intern at Lost Tracks and Juniper, and has also served on crews at Eugene CC as well as Claremont CC in the Bay area. He is full of excitement to do *anything* related to golf including volunteering time to work at Chambers Bay when it hosted the US Open and even caddying during the PGA Professionals Championship for winner, Matt Dobyns.
- 2. As a member of the PGA of America, he values every aspect of the golf operation and is a complement to the Professional staff on a day to day basis. The course conditions speak to Corey's innate ability to manage a crew and his devotion to his craft shines through on a daily basis. We as a professional staff love to have a person like Corey taking care of things, as we rarely have to hear anything but praise about the course conditioning from members and guests alike. What is so incredible about Corey and why we think he deserves this recognition is that he has accomplishments with a lean and mean skeleton crew for much of his tenure. Due to circumstances unforeseen, Corey worked much of the 2018 season without an Assistant Superintendant, but you would have never known if you were playing the course every day. He was able to keep the golf course immaculate with limited help and by elevating the skillsets of those around him.

Another incredible accomplishment in 2018 was the facelift of our 18th green complex that Corey led. While Casey Krahenbuhl, of DMK Golf, did the shaping and reclaiming of the original green, Corey's hand and leadership completed the project on barely any budget. He organized a crew of 15-18 employees (most from other departments) to help out with this project. The project included stripping/saving the sod of the original green and collar, filling in more than half of the greenside bunker, and transplanting additional sod from our nursery greens to ensure a smooth re-establishment. Most of these types of projects are outsourced completely, but Corey found a way to keep all expenses in-house and create a beautiful project expected to open for play in May 2019 (all work was completed in October 2018)!
