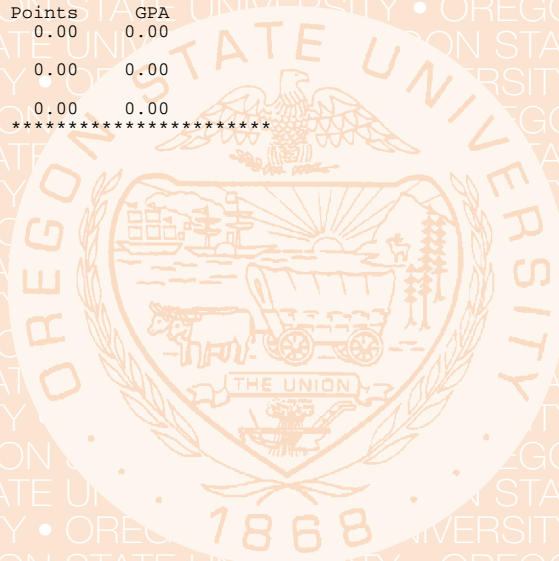

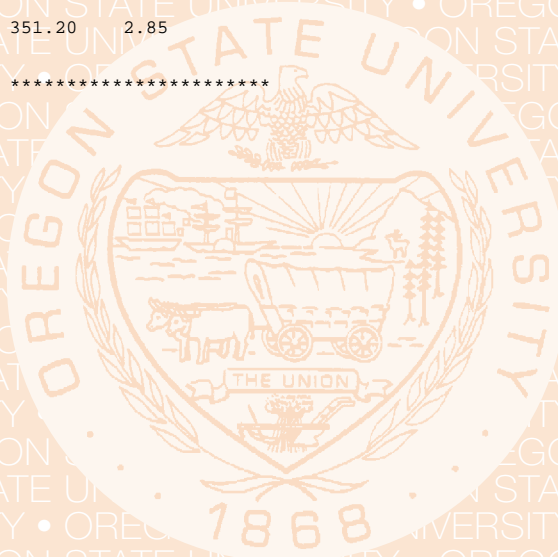

OREGON STATE UNIVERSITY

Oregon State University is the land-grant institution for the State of Oregon. In 1971 it was designated by the federal government as a sea-grant college, in 1991 received space-grant designation, and in 2004 received sun-grant designation. A second campus, Oregon State University-Cascades Campus, located in Central Oregon, was established in 2001.

CALENDAR

Oregon State University operates on a term/quarter system. Fall, Winter, and Spring terms are approximately 10 weeks in length with some shorter sessions inside the 10 weeks. These terms are followed by a one-week period of examinations. Summer term classes are conducted over 11 weeks with multiple shorter sessions inside the 11 weeks. During its existence, the K-12 system operated on the semester system with a full 18-week session Fall and Spring semester. Summer semester was conducted in a 9-week session.

ACCREDITATION

Oregon State University is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities, the regional accrediting agency. Several departments, schools, and colleges are accredited by professional accrediting associations recognized by the Council on Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA).

FORMER NAMES

Oregon State University was founded on October 27, 1868, as the State Agricultural College of Oregon. In 1929 the name was changed to Oregon State Agricultural College. In 1953 the name was changed to Oregon State College. On March 6, 1961, the name was changed to Oregon State University.

TIME STATUS

Full time status is defined as 12+ credits for undergraduate and post baccalaureate, 9+ credits for graduate students, 18+ for GE students. Half time status is defined as 6-11 credits for undergraduate and post baccalaureate, 5-8 credits for graduate students, and 15-17 credits for GE students. Part time status is defined as 1-5 credits for undergraduate and post baccalaureate, 1-4 credits for graduate students, and 1-14 credits for GE students.



INCOMPLETE/ALTERNATE GRADES

An I/Alternate Grade is depicted on the Oregon State

University transcript as an I/A, I/A-, I/B+, I/B, I/B-, I/C+, I/C, I/C-, I/D+, I/D, I/D-, I/F, I/P, I/N, I/S, and an I/U. This grade is to be treated as if it were an incomplete in all aspects. The notation of the alternate grade symbolizes what grade the student would earn if the student does not resolve the incomplete course work within one year of the recording of the incomplete or at the point of degree conferral (i.e., an I/D will revert to a D-). Once the incomplete is resolved or defaults to the alternate grade, the "I/Alternate Grade" will be replaced by a standard letter grade.

REPEATED COURSES

From Fall term 1972 to Summer term 1985, only the base grade earned in a course is credited to the student's grade point average and credits toward graduation. Effective Fall term 1985, all grades earned in a course are included in the student's grade point average. A grade followed by an "A" in the repeat column indicates a repeated course that will count in the cumulative grade point average, but not toward graduation. Effective Fall term 1997, courses may be repeated once for grade replacement. Although both grades appear on the transcript, only the second grade counts into the grade point average and toward graduation. Any course taken more than two times and is not repeatable, or previously passed, will appear on the transcript with a grade followed by an "R" indicating the course will not count in the cumulative grade point average, but toward graduation only.

Effective Summer term 2009, if a student repeats a course, the grade from each attempt will appear on the transcript, but only the second attempt will count toward the student's institutional credits and grade point average. Any course attempt with an "E" in the repeat column indicates that the course has been excluded from all calculations; this exclusion is either due to a course repeat or due to an historical practice through Summer term 2019 of excluding credits in excess of defined limits in academic regulation 25h.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of 180 credits must be earned. A minimum of 45 of the last 75 credits, or 150 total credits, must be completed while the student is in academic residence at OSU. Students may earn more than one bachelor's degree with the completion of the additional curriculum and minimum of 32 additional credits. Students earning an advanced degree usually earn a minimum of 45 credits.
